

An arrest in Orange County --

MR. FITZPATRICK: California?

MR. WALL: In California, with a conviction of seven months -- one year, all suspended but 60 days. Orange County constituted a violation of probation involved in the Colorado case. Probation was revoked and he was sentenced to seven months and therefore served seven months and the 60 -- sentenced to a year, which constitutes seven months in Colorado; that was served concurrently with the 60 days in California.

An arrest in Seattle for the Kathy Crampton case. A charge of kidnapping in the United States District Court for the Western District of Washington in Seattle; a non-jury trial resulting in an acquittal.

An arrest in Beverly Hills, California. A case which is presently pending.

Have I covered them all?

MR. FITZPATRICK: What about the Joann Grogen --

THE WITNESS: That's the Orange County --

MR. WALL: I know that the matter was in Tarrytown.

Q Were you ever charged with any criminal violations

MR. WALL: That type of case; the case was presented to the Grand Jury in the appropriate county; no true bill.

An arrest in Manhattan in 1974 for the seizure of Daniel Voll; a trial before Judge Bruce Wright, 1973, in the Criminal Court of the State of New York before a six-man jury; an acquittal.

An arrest in New York County on a charge of participating in the seizure of one Esther DeQuatro and transporting her to Pennsylvania. The case was presented to a Grand Jury; no true bill.

An arrest in Tarrytown, New York, on the charge of seizing one Mark Goodman. That is the first and only Unification Church case, I think, in this list. *✓ Patrick*
In January of 1975, I believe, the case was presented to a Westchester County Grand Jury; no true bill.

An arrest in Denver, Colorado, on a similar seizure, a trial, a conviction and a sentence to one year probation, one day in jail.

THE WITNESS: Seven.

MR. WALL: Seven days in jail. I will get back to that in a second.

Off the record.

Q How many times have you been arrested?

A You mean taken to jail?

Q Taken to jail or otherwise, how many times were you told that you were under arrest, and even if not taken to jail?

MR. WALL: May I suggest that the question be re-phrased to how many times formal charges have been laid against -- any charges.

Q How many times have you been formally charged with a criminal violation?

MR. WALL: I can do better than he, if you want information rather than recollection.

MR. FITZPATRICK: Why don't you do that, if there is anything to add or subtract, you can add.

MR. WALL: An arrest in Long Beach, New Jersey.

THE WITNESS: Yes.

MR. FITZPATRICK: Involving what, can you say?

MR. WALL: I cannot give you the names of the people; he can. I will just tick them off.
