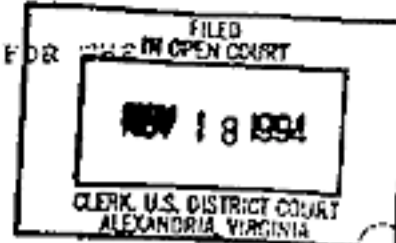

Statement of Facts

Had this matter gone to trial the evidence would have shown the following:

1. On the evening of May 5, 1992, Galen Kelly, along with Ira Bruschansky and Michelle Bruschansky, abducted Deborah Dobkowski against her will outside a parked car in the New York Ave. area of Washington D.C., by physically restraining her, placing her into a rented van, and driving her to Carrodoc Hall in Leesburg, Virginia, in the Eastern District of Virginia. At that time, Kelly believed that Dobkowski was actually another individual, Beth Bruckert. Kelly had been hired to "deprogram" Beth Bruckert by Bruckert's mother, who believed that Bruckert was a member of a cult. Kelly had several possible plans to deprogram Bruckert, one of which was to take Bruckert against her will.

2. Upon arriving at Carrodoc Hall, Kelly learned that they had abducted Dobkowski, who was Bruckert's roommate. They returned Dobkowski to the District of Columbia, and Kelly thereafter took steps to conceal the offense.

3. From that day until the time he was charged in connection with this matter, Kelly has never made this crime known to any judge or other person in authority under the United States.

Galen Kelly admits that the above facts are true and correct and that he committed the above acts knowingly and willfully, not by accident or mistake.
